

WHAT IS ASTROLOGY?

Astrology is an ancient field of study. As far back as we have recorded history, we have astrological concepts. Further back, scratches (made by Neolithic hunters) on reindeer horns correspond to the phases of the Moon.

Astrology uses the patterns of the heavens to more fully understand life on Earth. The positions of the planets are seen as symbolizing personality traits and tendencies, as well as human cycles of development. Using a horoscope is like looking in a mirror; we can see ourselves more clearly and easily as unique individuals. Just as the mirror does not **set** our appearance, but only **reflects** it, so the planets do not **create** our personalities, but only **reflect** them.

Using astrology to describe personality strengths, weaknesses, talents, abilities and challenges requires a **natal** (or birth) horoscope. A natal horoscope is like a map of the sky for your instant of birth, looking from the viewpoint of your birthplace. Your moment of birth gives a "freeze frame"--an exact snapshot of the positions of all the planets. No one else has the same horoscope as you--unless they were born in the exact same place, at the exact same minute, as you were.

The next few pages of this report will introduce you to the basic tools of astrology -- planets, aspects (how the planets relate to each other at a given moment), houses, and signs. The remainder of **Your Astro Analysis** will be devoted to interpreting each of the planets in **your** horoscope, in terms of their placement in signs, houses, and aspects.

PLANETS

Planets are one of the four basic building blocks of astrology. When astrologers say "planets," they usually refer to the eight planets of our solar system other than Earth (Mercury, Venus, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, Neptune and Pluto) plus the Sun and the Moon. We know that the Sun is actually a star and the Moon is actually a satellite, but it is simplest to call all bodies planets.

Astrologically, each of the planets represents a drive or need within

you. A planet is like the verb in a sentence; it indicates where the action is. Planets compromise the most important building block in astrology. Following is a brief description of each of the planets.

Just as the **Sun** is the center of our solar system, so is it the center of the horoscope. Our Sun in the solar system provides light and makes life possible. The Sun in the horoscope is a key to vitality, life force, and our central, creative urge. The Sun represents our need to shine, our desire for recognition, our self-esteem, and pride/shame issues.

Wherever our Sun is (in one of 12 houses, and in one of 12 signs), we want to be admired, noticed, loved, or applauded by the world. We feel most vital and alive when expressing the themes of our Sun's house and sign. Since it is a key to vitality and zest, we naturally pour energy into the activities represented by our Sun's house and sign.

The **Moon** (which shines by reflected light) is a key to our inner emotions, particularly our need for emotional security and safety. It symbolizes our dependency needs and our desire to nurture and care for others. It represents the people we depend on, the parent who was a nurturing figure, and our capacity to be an assisting, helpful, caring individual. It also is a key to our home, our roots (ancestry), and our sensitivities.

Wherever the Moon is (by house and sign), we want to nurture or be nurtured, to make warm, emotional connections with others. Family feelings may be sought or explored and emotions are the focus.

Mercury represents our need to communicate. It is a key to our verbal ability, our logic, our capacity to be objective and detached. Mercury symbolizes the conscious, reasoning mind that observes the world, gathers information, learns, teaches, and disseminates knowledge.

Wherever Mercury is in our horoscope (by house and sign), we are curious, interested, and want to know. We may learn and/or teach in that area. Our Mercury placements help to describe our verbal styles and the way we use our minds.

Venus represents our need to enjoy the physical world and the world of relationships. Venus could be called the pleasure principle; we may seek pleasure through money, possessions, tangible beauty, or sensual gratification. We may also seek pleasure through relationships, through sharing, through partnerships with others. Venus is a key to affection, love, our need for balance, our appreciation of beauty, and our orientation toward ease, comfort, and personal enjoyment.

Wherever Venus is in our horoscope (by house and sign), we want to enjoy! We seek pleasure, comfort, ease, beauty, grace, love, and goodness in the areas inhabited by Venus.

Mars represents our need to assert ourselves, to defend our own rights, to identify and go after what we want in the world. Mars can be a key to healthy self-expression and personal power, but it can also represent aggression, fights, arguments, anger and negative forms of assertion. Mars is an indicator of our basic physical energy and health, sexual drive, where we seek freedom, our desire to do things on our own, and our sense of basic identity.

Wherever Mars is in our horoscope (by house and sign), we want to express ourselves, be free and be active. If the personal energy symbolized by Mars is blocked, we might experience physical or interpersonal problems as a result of not defending our own needs. If we carry Martian themes too far, we may be rash, impulsive or self-centered in the areas where Mars lies. If we balance our Martian side with other drives, we can be assertive in a healthy fashion, meeting our own needs and drives in a constructive manner.

Jupiter represents our need to believe and to aspire. It indicates our ideals, what we tend to value and want more of in life. It is also a key to where we can exaggerate or overdo. Jupiter indicates potential opportunities and the confidence to pursue our visions.

Wherever Jupiter is in our horoscope (by house and sign), we tend to place our faith. We are likely to seek more in that area, and may even overexpand. (If we see something as good, more is better.) Jupiter's placement may indicate that an individual values money, or a partner, a religion, etc. Where Jupiter is a key, we may idealize (and put a part of life on a pedestal) or expect more than is possible. Jupiter symbolizes our optimistic spirit, where we tend to look on the bright side, have hope, and see the highest potentials.

Saturn represents our need to structure life and test reality. Saturn is a key to the limits of life: what we can do, cannot do, and have to do. It is also symbolic of authority figures in our lives: from the rulemaker parent (usually Dad) to police officers and presidents. Saturn symbolizes our career, our conscience, our ambitions and our need to have power over the physical world.

Wherever Saturn is in our horoscope (by house and sign), we learn to face reality and what is possible. We often deal with consequences (cause and effect). Saturn represents the principle of learning through

experience (sometimes the "school of hard knocks"). Where Saturn principles are carried too far, people may feel blocked, inhibited, incapable, incompetent, or unable to do anything. Where Saturn principles are ignored, people may push the world (or others) until they discover certain principles (including the laws of the land) are bigger than they are; eventually we reap the consequences of what we have sown. People who are balanced in their expression of what Saturn represents are practical achievers who do as much as is possible within the structures of society. Saturn is a key to our capacity to learn by doing, to deal sensibly with the material world, to work responsibly, and to produce tangible results.

Uranus represents our need to change and alter. It is a key to our drive for individuality and uniqueness. Uranus symbolizes our need for the freedom to be different, to explore alternatives, and to look toward the future and progress.

Wherever Uranus is in our horoscope (by house and sign), we need to be independent. We need to come from our own unique essence. Our Uranus placements indicate where we seek space, where we can innovate and be inventive. (They also indicate where we can be surprised.) Uranus mirrors our urge to consider alternatives, to be open and to be equalitarian.

Neptune represents our need to merge and seek transcendence. Neptune is a key to our search for the beautiful dream. That may be sought through art, through healing or helping activities, or through escapist means. Neptune indicates our drive to experience Oneness, to be a part of the whole, to connect with something Higher or ecstatic in life. We may seek transcendence through spiritual or religious paths, be "swept away" in nature worship, look to drugs for ecstasy, live in a "perfect" fantasy world, or find inspiration in philanthropy and compassionate assistance of humanity.

Wherever Neptune is in our horoscope (by house and sign), we want to be inspired and must be wary of rose-colored glasses. We need to feel uplifted where our Neptune is placed, and may fool ourselves into viewing matters through a romantic haze. We seek transcendent experiences in the areas connected to Neptune in our horoscope.

Pluto represents our need to relate intimately with another person and with our own psyche. Pluto is another key to sexuality: our drive to share the world (especially sensually and financially) with another person--and learning about ourselves through interacting with someone else. Pluto also indicates our inner drive for self-mastery, self-insight and self-under-

standing. Pluto themes have to do with depth analysis, tearing things down and regeneration and transformation as well.

Wherever Pluto is in our horoscope (by house and sign), we tend to probe beneath the surface. We tend to pick at, and examine carefully those areas, looking for hidden meanings and deeper layers. We may tear down and then build up, analyze carefully, and then rework and transform. Pluto also symbolizes our approach to shared resources, money, and sexuality. Pluto represents our deepest, most intense feelings and our capacity to share power, pleasure and possessions with another person.

Following are some key words for each of the planets.

Sun: self-esteem, life force/vitality, creativity, risk-taking instincts, pride, star quality, funloving spirit, inner child, drive for excitement, need for recreation, speculative side, sexual passion, need to shine.

Moon: emotions, security needs, caretaking instincts, dependency needs, drive to nurture, vulnerabilities, homing instincts, receptivity, moods, habit patterns, women (including mother).

Mercury: urge to communicate, thinking, listening/talking, capacity to learn cognitively, adaptability/flexibility, information-gathering skills, casual contacts, logic, conscious awareness, dexterity, intellectual perception.

Venus: desire for pleasure, sensuality, urge for comfort/ease, need for tangible beauty, drive for stability/predictability, sweetness, affection, relating needs, material assets.

Mars: assertion, self-expression, independence, personal power, desires, spontaneous instincts, immediate needs, anger, sexual drive, early identity, doing one's thing, need to be first, energy level.

Jupiter: ideals and goals, beliefs, values, morality/ethics, faith, optimism, quest for the truth, philosophy/religion, drive for expanded horizons, high expectations, seeking the best/highest, expansiveness.

Saturn: reality quotient, response to and desire for authority, attitudes toward the orthodoxy and what society deems appropriate, practicality, capacity to deal with limits, career drives, sense of responsibility, discipline/ effort, status ambitions, urge to solidify/contract, wisdom of experience.

Uranus: individuality, freedom drives, inventiveness, originality, humanitarian instincts, detachment, pull toward the future, eccentricity, innovation, sudden changes, interest in technology, the new or "cutting edge."

Neptune: quest for Oneness/Union/transcendence, idealism, quest for infinite love and beauty, intuition, savior/victim potentials, compassion, imagination/fantasy, mysticism, escapism.

Pluto: intensity, drive for self-mastery, intimacy instincts, sexual needs, drive for transformation, elimination/completion urges, resentment/forgiveness, probing, complicated motives, compulsions, addictions, resourcefulness.

SIGNS OF THE ZODIAC

Your "sky map" (horoscope) places planets in any of 12 signs and any of 12 houses. Each planet has a different meaning, depending upon the house and the sign of the zodiac which it occupies.

The zodiac is an imaginary circle, out in space. (This circle is **not** the same as the constellations with the same names as the zodiac signs.) The zodiac is determined by the Earth's seasons and the Earth's path around the Sun. The Earth's path around the Sun, extended into infinity, forms the circle of the zodiac. The position of the Sun at the vernal equinox--spring in the Northern Hemisphere--defines 0 degrees of the sign Aries--the beginning of the zodiac. Looking out from the Earth, we see each planet in front of a certain part of the zodiac circle. That position determines what sign of the zodiac the planet is in.

Your **day of birth** determines the sign of the zodiac occupied by the Sun. That is your "Sun sign" which many popular columns abbreviate to just "your sign." The zodiac signs occupied by the other planets are determined by both your **year** of birth and your **day** of birth.

Your **time of birth** may be needed to know your Moon sign, because the Moon changes signs about every 2-1/2 days. Also, if you were born on a day when the Sun or a planet was changing signs (near a boundary point of the zodiacal circle), you will need to know your time of birth to determine which sign that planet is in. (Remember, astrologers call the Sun and Moon "planets" for convenience, even though the Sun is a star

and the Moon is a satellite.)

The signs modify the planets, like adjectives modify verbs in English. You will express the drive symbolized by the planet in a manner described by the sign it occupies. Here are a few keywords for the signs.

Aries: assertive, brave, first, impetuous, energetic, self-oriented, pioneering, rash, competitive, rapid, eager, likes to be on one's own, lives in the present.

Taurus: comfortable, deliberate, dependable, placid, possessive, sensual, patient, loyal, thorough, stubborn, stable, money-oriented, practical, artistic.

Gemini: fluent, versatile, curious, intermittent, clever, nimble, quickwitted, adaptable, scattered, gossipy, dextrous, lighthearted, superficial, articulate.

Cancer: nurturing, warm, dependent, sympathetic, protective, security-oriented, maternal, patriotic, retentive, helpful, moody, domestic, touchy (easily hurt), focused on family.

Leo: creative, risk-taking, charismatic, funloving, generous, exciting, dramatic, proud, self-confident, childish, ambitious, arrogant, self-conscious (fears ridicule), enthusiastic.

Virgo: work-oriented, painstaking, efficient, pragmatic, exacting, discreet, industrious, finds flaws, pedantic, methodical, detail-oriented, concerned with health/cleanliness.

Libra: cooperative, diplomatic, fence-sitting, competitive, aesthetic, charming, easily deterred, refined, sociable, seeks a partner/companion, placates, equalitarian.

Scorpio: penetrating, intense, resourceful, powerful, compulsive, determined, jealous, passionate, secretive, probing, suspicious, fascinated by the hidden/taboo.

Sagittarius: benevolent, optimistic, extravagant, athletic, enthusiastic, idealistic, philosophical, freedom-loving, exaggerative, blunt, overindulgent, broad-minded, just.

Capricorn: responsible, formal, traditional, authoritative, career-oriented, cautious, inhibited, hardworking, scrupulous, conventional, status-seeking, economical, businesslike.

Aquarius: unique, rebellious, futuristic, independent, inventive, objective, intellectual, unpredictable, tolerant, eccentric, aloof, progressive, has a wide perspective.

Pisces: compassionate, mystical, illusory, sensitive, spiritual, dreamy, artistic, passive, sacrificial, intuitive, charitable, impractical, escapist, visionary, inspirational.

As you can see, each sign has a number of different possibilities. The symbols of astrology work on many levels. Everything has **more than one** meaning. Note that most potentials have both an "up" side and a "down" side--a positive and a negative. Astrology simply mirrors our potentials. We have the power to manifest either side in our lives (and we can change from one to the other by applying effort).

The interpretations following examine the sign positions of **your** planets. The potentials discussed will not cover **every single** potential. You could extrapolate additional possibilities by combining the key words given here for signs with the descriptions provided of planets.

YOUR PLANETS IN SIGNS

Here's a quick look at some of the possibilities implied by the sign your Sun is in.

The Sun is in the sign of Gemini in your chart.

You need to shine fluently.

You may gain or seek recognition for your verbal skills. This could vary from the teacher/professor, the neighborhood gossip, the punster, the user of an extensive vocabulary, the chatterbox, the linguist, etc. You can be quite creative in terms of your perceptiveness and ability to compare, contrast, and find connections between concepts.

You need to shine versatilely.

You are likely to be proud of your versatility (or ashamed of your tendency to scatter with multiple interests). You may shine in diverse areas. A wide variety of social contacts and open dissemination of information aid your self-expression.

You seek recognition for your cleverness.

You want to feel proud of your mind or thinking ability. You are likely to be ego-vulnerable in terms of mental pursuits or communication skills. Pride/shame issues are tied to your mind. You need to express yourself verbally and to gain favorable recognition for your intellect.

You need to shine for nimbleness/curiosity.

You could achieve attention for your nimbleness, dexterity, quickwittedness or good hand-eye coordination. (This can range from the skilled typist, surgeon, musician, etc. to the pickpocket.) You may be noted for your curiosity (in a positive or negative sense). You could be recognized for your dexterity or flexibility.

Remember, we have only considered some of the possibilities suggested by your Sun sign. Lots more could be said concerning this single factor, but it's time to take a look at some of the other planets in your horoscope.

The Moon is in the sign of Libra in your chart.

Your emotions gravitate toward beauty, grace and harmony. You can be quite affectionate, good natured and charming and are generally popular with others. You may sometimes appear chameleon-like, adopting the attitudes of those around you; you might even succumb to seeming fickle or capricious. If you are too caught up in "looking good" (graceful, charming), you could inhibit your emotional responses and block real intimacy. Because you need relationships, you may sometimes have trouble being alone. Emotional connections with others are important to you, although you may feel torn between nurturing (and being nurtured) versus relating as an equal and a peer. Because fairness matters to you, you might weigh matters too much and be indecisive. You have an intuitive grasp of polarities and a desire to seek a synthesis (middle ground).

Mercury is in the sign of Taurus in your chart.

Your mind and tongue tend to work deliberately and steadily. You may sometimes get stuck in ruts mentally, but can be very practical and grounded, with a good, retentive mind. Business skills are likely, or anything putting your common sense to work. You may learn through tactile contact or physical manipulation of the world. You may sometimes limit your perceptions due to a desire to learn slowly and carefully. You

want to bring ideas down to earth, and are likely to be interested in money, sensuality and physical comforts.

Venus is in the sign of Aries in your chart.

You are likely to enjoy activity and doing things **once**. (Repetition bores you.) You can be assertive in relating to people and probably appreciate courage. Your desire nature is emphasized; sensuality comes naturally to you. Your handling of money/possessions is direct, forceful and may occasionally be impulsive. You want freedom in your love relationships. You enjoy **beginning** relationships (and may prefer early to later stages). You express affection impulsively, directly, and honestly and prefer an enthusiastic, energetic response from others. You like independence, initiative and action in yourself (and others).

Mars is in the sign of Aries in your chart.

You probably need to be physically active and tend to be naturally assertive. You may be direct, forceful, and competitive. Self-expression is important to you. Doing your own thing is essential. You may have a flair for starting things or mechanical skills. Although you are good at facing obstacles and confrontation, rashness may sometimes get you in trouble. You can be impatient and function best with lots of freedom, variety and capacity to pioneer. You are probably restless, willful and have a high degree of initiative. Your sexual drive and physical energy are likely to be high; you may be impulsive in sexual matters. Your identity is tied to independence and spontaneity.

Jupiter is in the sign of Virgo in your chart.

As one of the outer planets, Jupiter spends a fair amount of time in each sign (about one year). Thus, the themes which are indicated are shared by people your age. The house placement of Jupiter will have more to say about how you handle beliefs, values, education, religion and expectations, along with your cultural background and individual essence.

You tend to value work, productivity, efficiency and/or health. Your beliefs are probably connected to your job and sense of dedication. Your ethics/morals may highlight the puritan virtues. You may idealize purity, cleanliness, precision. You are learning to blend idealistic visions with practical reality, without begin chronically dissatisfied, overly judgmental, perfectionistic, or giving up too soon; a positive blend allows you to visualize the best and take concrete steps to manifest it. You tend to put your trust into hard work and self-discipline. You are probably ever ready to improve yourself. You are likely to grow through dedicated service and

competent helpfulness.

Saturn is in the sign of Cancer in your chart.

Saturn takes about 29-1/2 years to travel the zodiac circuit, so spends about 2-1/2 years in each sign. Thus, you share certain themes with people around your age. How you handle these issues, however, will depend on you (and your whole horoscope--including the house placement of Saturn). The challenge with any Saturn placement is to be appropriately realistic. People often take on either too little or too much responsibility in the areas connected to their Saturn's house and sign placements. Practice doing what is possible, neither giving up (fearing failure), nor trying to control and handle everything, but working pragmatically within the limits of the world.

You are likely to feel very responsible toward family and might feel insecure/overburdened at times. You need to balance dependency and being in control in your life. You may have to overcome fears of vulnerability or a tendency to constantly play parent in life. You can be quite helpful. You may have an urge to control your emotions; strive to allow them and to express them (perhaps within a practical structure). Your career might involve a family business, the land, the public, women, food, shelter, commodities or anything relating to emotional security.

Uranus is in the sign of Gemini in your chart.

Because Uranus spends about 7 years in each sign, it symbolizes issues for a rather large group of people. The house position of Uranus will help to reveal how and where each individual might deal with the issues represented by Uranus' sign. The house position of Uranus may also represent traits which are more personal, less tied to one's age peers.

You may be unique in your thinking or communicating. You could challenge life intermittently, logically, verbally. You may make intellectual shifts and changes. You seek freedom of thought. When you break loose, you do so cleverly, in spurts, adroitly or mentally.

Neptune is in the sign of Libra in your chart.

Because Neptune spends about 13-14 years in each sign, its position points to issues which are relevant for a whole group of people (over half of a generation). Each person will still have his/her personal reactions to these general issues, but the underlying themes will be shared with many people. (Thanks to Marilyn Waram in THE BOOK OF NEPTUNE for

many historical notes which are used here.)

You may idealize/romanticize in relationships. You might sacrifice on behalf of balance and harmony, or expect too much grace, compassion and perfection from your partners. You are likely to have talent in the visual arts and to value justice and fair play. You want "heaven on earth" in human interactions.

Historically, this was a time (1942/43-1955/57) when dreams, hopes and visions regarding interpersonal relationships were reexamined and clarified. World War II and the Korean War gave us opportunities to examine the fantasies about war and strip away some glamor. This half-generation was also the one to confront "happily ever after" images of marriage and to face massive disillusionment (and divorces) when Prince and Princess Charming turned out to be fallible human beings. Seeking true equality was supported by the Supreme Court's decision against segregation in schools.

Drug use (one form of escapism and not facing reality) in the music and art world was uncovered and people's illusions were stripped away there as well.

Pluto is in the sign of Leo in your chart.

Because Pluto's orbit is so long (248 years to circle the zodiac), it spends from 12 to 32 years in a single sign. Thus, it operates as a marker of generations, pointing to themes shared by large groups of people. Still, people's house positions for Pluto and cultural backgrounds as well as individual natures will affect how they deal with these generational Plutonic themes. (Thanks to Marion March and Joan McEvers in THE ONLY WAY TO..LEARN ASTROLOGY for historical examples.)

You may probe deeply in matters of love, creativity, speculation or children. You may bond/feel intimate through being onstage, seeking thrills or being passionate. You could focus on giving and receiving love, admiration, attention, or approval. You need a good channel (sports, games, business) for your power drive.

Historically, Pluto was in Leo from 1938-1957. Explosive power was released with the first atomic bomb. Dictatorships (abuse of power) reigned in many parts of the world.

HOUSES OF THE HOROSCOPE

Your time of birth is required to know which houses are occupied by the planets. Houses are a division of space based on the Earth's 24-hour rotation. The Earth turns completely on its axis in one 24-hour period (creating our day and night). The space within which we turn is divided into 12 areas called houses. As we look out from your place of birth, at your moment of birth, each planet will be in an area of space designated as one or another of the 12 astrological houses. Houses are shown as the pie-shaped wedges in a circular horoscope (and are numbered 1 through 12 in a counter-clockwise direction).

The line which separates one house from the next is called a cusp. Certain house cusps are considered to have extra significance in astrology. One is the cusp of the 1st house. The first house defines what was "rising" at the time of your birth. (If you were born around sunrise, the Sun will be near the cusp of your 1st house.) The cusp of the 1st is also called the Ascendant. Astrologers consider the sign on the Ascendant (the "rising sign") an important key to personal identity and action. Similarly the sign on the cusp of the 10th house (the Midheaven) is considered significant in matters of career and status.

Houses (like signs) represent inner drives and needs, but houses have other meanings as well. Houses represent certain areas of life, and other people in our lives, in addition to inner psychological issues. For example, the 3rd house represents our capacity to learn, our logic and objectivity, and our communication skills. The third house also symbolizes the people we first practice learning and communicating with: brothers, sisters, neighbors and people near-at-hand.

Because the outer planets (Jupiter through Pluto) take so long to orbit the Sun, they occupy each sign of the zodiac for a rather long time. (A whole generation may have Pluto in the same sign of the zodiac.) The house a planet occupies is thus a much more personal statement than the sign a planet occupies. (Houses depend on the place and **time** of birth so are more individual.)

Following is a list of keywords for the houses.

1st house: personal action, identity, self-expression, spontaneous instincts, physical body, the beginning of life, appearance, what you do naturally.

2nd house: possessions and pleasures, sensuality, money, comfort, stability, capacity to earn a living, tangible beauty, physical security, your material base.

3rd house: communication, relatives, learning capacity, lightheartedness, short trips, transportation, media, early schooling, immediate environment, conscious mind.

4th house: home, family, emotional vulnerabilities, nurturing instincts, roots, real estate, parent who was main nurturer, heredity and ancestry, emotional needs.

5th house: risk-taking, procreation, creativity, onstage activities, lovers, children, romance, speculation, hobbies, recreation, love given and received.

6th house: competence, efficiency, work, health, handling of details, colleagues and co-workers, tenants, servants, employees, routines, nutrition, hygiene.

7th house: partners and partnership, need for balance, harmony, aesthetics, contracts, lawsuits, competitors, attitude toward marriage, grandparent(s), spouse.

8th house: depth investigations, shared money and resources, intimacy instincts, sexuality, debts, taxes, inheritance, hidden matters, surgery, endings, therapy.

9th house: aspirations, beliefs, values, world view (religion/philosophy), optimism, law, science, ideals, higher education, distant travel/cultures, grandchildren, spiritual consciousness.

10th house: sense of responsibility, career, authorities, reality principle, status, employer, how the world sees you, rulemaker parent, achievements.

11th house: drive for individuation, originality, friends, groups, networking, hopes for future, foster and step-children, clubs, organizations.

12th house: desire for infinite love and beauty, union, mysticism, imagination, institutions, unconscious mind, charity, hidden weaknesses and strengths.

The interpretations supplied later cover some of the potentials for the

houses occupied by planets in **your** natal (birth) horoscope. If you also look over the descriptions of the planets, and blend them with the house descriptions provided here, you may be able to identify more possibilities.

YOUR PLANETS IN HOUSES

The Sun is in your 8th house.

Your self-esteem is tied to your capacity to dig beneath the surface in life (and in your own psyche) and to achieve self-mastery. You may seek admiration for your self-control, intensity or depth of insight. You could be proud (or ashamed) of your capacity to transform, regenerate and renew. You may rejoice in intense emotional exchanges, feeling that what really matters in life lies many layers down. Your ego could affect matters of sexuality and shared money and possessions. Power struggles over shared resources and pleasures are possible if either you or your mate is too ego-vulnerable and tries to overcontrol in these areas. Strong, passionate responses are likely in the realms of sex and money; you could be quite dramatic in dealing with financial and sensual issues. You are willing to face the "dark side" in yourself and others, mastering obsessive needs and drives. You may achieve recognition through your capacity to eliminate nonessentials and to creatively transform negatives into positives.

Your love relationships need an element of passion and should utterly fascinate you, with a compelling allure. An all-or-nothing tendency is likely in love relationships (and you may sometimes withdraw into a hermit or celibate lifestyle). If your own powerful inner urges are denied, children and/or lovers may express them in excess. They could be too intent on having their own way, demanding, manipulative, willful, or emotionally volatile. Yet you and those you love can be incredibly loyal and very dedicated. You may experience magnetism on a gut level, with strong sensual and sexual overtones. You are learning to share possessions and pleasures, and to face the depths of your psyche with those closest to you. You can face the monsters (inside and outside) in order to achieve the heights of ecstasy.

The Moon is in your 12th house.

Your emotional security is tied to the universe and feeling Oneness with the whole. You are naturally intuitive, and drawn toward experiences

of transcendence. You want to be uplifted, swept away, to merge with something Higher and transcendent. You have a drive to protect and conserve the highest, the most ideal and the most beautiful in life. You remember fantasies, visions, dreams and inspirations. You can be quite gentle, compassionate, idealistic, kind and sensitive. You understand the unity of all life and have a natural empathy. You tend to romanticize and idealize nurturing qualities and may strive to be the all-loving, all-giving figure (who ends up in martyred self-sacrifice). Or, you may seek cosmic caretaking--looking for someone else to provide unconditional love, assistance and protection for you. You are "fed" by inspirational experiences (whether artistic or helping/healing), but don't get carried away with trying to "be everything" for someone else or expecting "Heaven on Earth" yourself.

Your mother (figure) provided a (positive or negative) role model for handling the quest for infinite love and beauty. She might have been artistic, a savior (rescuing and assisting others) or a victim. She could have been lovely, idealistic or self-sacrificing. Her example affected you strongly on unconscious levels and you may want to do some work with journals, dreams, visualization or other nonverbal means to clean up and clear up as needed. Be sure your emotional responses are your own. Your family bred imagination, artistry, saving instincts, martyrdom or escapism. The past either built or challenged your capacity to seek the beautiful and idyllic in life. You function best with a home which is like a sanctuary: beautiful, soothing and a retreat from the traumas of the real world. You need some time alone to meditate or work through your inner feelings and impressions, including getting rid of emotions you pick up from other people. Your Higher Self is close to the surface of your awareness and can provide assistance, illumination and uplifting encouragement.

Mercury is in your 7th house.

Your mental approach is to weigh, balance and seek equality. You probably think about justice, relationships, fair play and equality. You are apt to be curious about interpersonal interactions, aesthetics and the process of give-and-take. Your interests revolve around people exchanges, visual beauty and harmony. You tend to learn what is pleasurable and may prefer not to "work" at it. Your communication style is likely to be diplomatic, tactful, charming or other-oriented. Your words may flow forth with grace and harmony.

Your consciousness centers on relationships, balance and beauty. You can be lighthearted about people exchanges and loveliness; you need stimulation (especially intellectual) in your partnerships. If you deny

your more casual, flippant side, you may attract a partner who is scattered, overly rational, cool, or too restless to settle down. You may unconsciously look to your partner to stimulate your thinking, or to initiate communication. Social contacts will be an important part of your relationships. You may enjoy the art of negotiation (perhaps comparing and contrasting a bit too much with others). You have a natural skill for meeting people on their own level.

Venus is in your 6th house.

You are likely to seek security in your work: regularity and predictability. You also want to enjoy what you do; you work for pleasure as well as material rewards. You may enjoy efficiency, productivity and obtaining tangible results. You could find comfort in being competent, capable and dedicated. Security, for you, comes from doing your best, especially in work and health. Your possessions are practical and may be work-oriented. You could earn money through health, healing, analysis, handling details, repairs, or a concentrated focus. You may work on relationships (e.g., counseling), do artistic work, beauty work, sensual work (e.g., massage), or financial work. Your job should provide comfort, pleasure and security.

If carried to an extreme, the desire for ease can lead to expecting work to flow without effort. Such people may be too passive and lazy to be effective. They may desire a beautiful job, but be unwilling to work for it. They may try to charm others into working for them. If the Venus urges are projected, co-workers may be too hedonistic, hung up on physical beauty or sensual indulgences.

In terms of health, the orientation is toward comfort. You are not prone to disciplined pursuits. You might overindulge, especially in sweet things. (Sugar can be a substitute for love.) Illness could also be an (unconscious) escape from having to work hard--or an unconscious route to being pampered and indulged. You are likely to prefer the easy way in regard to health care and may be quite concerned with its effect on your appearance. Yet you enjoy feeling good and can steadily and reliably pursue a program once you've made a habit of it.

Your social interactions are often work-related, or involve overtones of improvement and fixing up. You might turn partnership into a career (counselor or the person whose profession is wife); work with people (personnel administrator); work at marriage (dedicated, responsible); marry someone to work for you (often a workaholic); work **for** a partner (attracting people who need some improvement); or see relating as a job (critical, judgmental, flaw-finding). Your partner may be hardworking,

humble, pragmatic, critical, nitpicking or restrained. Your relationships are an arena for you to develop and constructively channel your efficiency urges, critical judgment, service needs and analytical abilities.

Mars is in your 6th house.

Your identity is tied to a need to function efficiently. It is almost as if, "to be is to work." This can be an extremely productive, dedicated, hardworking combination. You may naturally analyze, produce, discriminate, and improve. If carried to an extreme, you might be susceptible to performance anxiety, constantly nit-picking and feeling you should do things more perfectly. You might also identify too strongly with your job: "I am what I do, and I am nothing unless I am working and being productive." Learning to relax and enjoy could be a challenge. You could be quiet, efficient, dedicated and practical. Your courage is expressed through exacting efforts, dedicated analysis and unceasing discrimination; you face hard work unflinchingly and do what is necessary. Your will is focused and concentrated; you are very organized. Your energy is directly very capably; you will get the job done well. You may get angry with colleagues or co-workers, especially if you feel tasks are not being done "up to snuff." Your standards are exacting. You push hard on the job, dedicated to competence and productivity.

Another extreme is the person who says "I will only work when I want, where I want, and how I want." The self-will of Mars is carried to the extreme of "If I cannot do it my way, I won't do it at all!" This can be the individual who is constantly quitting or getting fired from one job to the next. The person may feel that colleagues are quarrelsome, aggressive or selfish. If the willful Martian energy is channeled into appropriate fields, a job involving physical activity (forest ranger, sports, etc.), assertion or aggression (military, police) or anything independent, self-expressive, competitive, or challenging with minimum of repetition is appropriate.

You may also assert yourself in matters of health. You can be very direct and forthright in pursuing good health, and might sometimes be aggressive in promoting nutritional or other health concepts. If your anger is not channelled into accomplishment, or you lack the desired freedom and variety in your work, one danger is health difficulties. Bottled up frustration can lead to minor cuts, burns, accidents (energy unconsciously turned against the self), fevers or even major surgery. An active pursuit of good health (with focus on exercise, diet, etc.) is in your best interest. You can be a pioneer in this area, as well as in your chosen vocational field.

Jupiter is in your 11th house.

You believe in and value individuality, uniqueness and independence. You trust (put your faith in) progress, the future and freedom. Your world view is open, tolerant and allows many different perspectives. You seek understanding of all people, humanitarian principles and how to keep one's options truly open. You can probably relate to just about anyone in the world. A natural motivator, you can be the spark plug in groups, generating enthusiastic activity and the confidence to keep on going. You may expect a lot from friends and your social networks (and they of you), but you are also likely to encourage the best in one another. Your humor can emerge in group situations or with friends or causes.

You probably want to expand and enlarge your seeking of freedom from restrictions; beware of demanding **too much** independence or rebelling against structure of any sort. Much restlessness is likely. You may enjoy theorizing about modern technology or the new, different or changing. You might tend to generalize about the future, social causes or tolerance and could be intolerant by jumping to conclusions. Your ethics/moral principles are individualistic and may be rebellious. You are probably eager to learn about anything on the cutting edge of change and can teach enthusiastically about the new and progressive.

Saturn is in your 9th house.

You may structure your values, beliefs and world view and may over-control your faith. You may value order, predictability and thoroughness. Your belief system might be based on material reality (the scientist, the agnostic) or you could go through a "crisis of faith"--wondering if there is any meaning or higher purpose to life. If anxiety seems overwhelming, you may seek security through a firm, conservative religion or philosophical approach. You are likely to have a responsible attitude toward truth, ethics and inspiration. You may be susceptible to guilt regarding religion, spirituality or values. Moral or ethical issues could carry a karmic charge in your life. You could feel limited by your education, or by your belief system, and need to learn to trust what you gain through experience.

Your father (figure) is an important influence (pro or con) on your beliefs and values. He could be idolized and idealized (even if not present). He might have been religious, idealistic or perfectionistic. He could have been ethical, philosophical and broad-minded. You might perceive authorities (including Dad) as adventurous, optimistic, humorous, distant, overconfident, extravagant or grandiose.

Your career needs to involve travel, the dissemination of knowledge,

education, philosophy, good times, sales, sports, nature or ethics. Your duties may include learning, fun, travel or expanded horizons in some form. You may believe in the work ethic, search for the perfect job, labor for a better world or seek idealistic, motivational and inspirational work.

Uranus is in your 8th house.

You may challenge the status quo in regard to sexuality and shared resources. You could change and reform your intimate associations and the process of emotional bonding. You may invent or originate approaches for facing the Shadow (tough psychological issues), dealing with hidden depths and transforming yourself and others. You are likely to break the rules about giving, receiving and sharing with others and could play the rebel role in your handling of sexuality, inheritance, partner's resources and the deeper emotions. You can be driven emotionally (obsessive, compulsive, addicted), yet are also capable of great detachment and objectivity; extreme swings are possible before you integrate these polarities.

Freedom, for you, is connected to intimacy, intensity and deep, inner drives. You may feel pulled between your quest for independence and your desire to merge with another human being. Ideally, you can turn friends into lovers and lovers into friends. You may revolutionize boundaries between self and other, death and life. You can be tolerant of probing, elimination and purification.

Neptune is in your 12th house.

Your imagination is rich and many faceted. Your flair for fantasy can add inspiration and whimsy to your life--and can lead you down the garden path if the connection to reality becomes too tenuous. You could idealize or romanticize union, empathy, compassion, religion or beauty. You have a strong urge to merge with the universe, seeking ultimate meaning and Oneness. You can heal and rescue others in a very caring, selfless manner. You yearn for infinite love and beauty and need to transcend through uniting with the Whole, becoming one with All That Is.

You may be strongly drawn by the roles of artist, savior or victim. The artist is creating a more beautiful world, bringing a divine vision down to earth, and inspiring others with it. The savior is motivated to help, to heal, to assist, to rescue people and to make a better world (closer to utopian images). The victim also yearns for a wondrous, magical dream but feel unable or unwilling to create it--so escapes into drugs, alcohol, daydreaming, excessive TV-watching, etc. That could include avoiding and ignoring anything that does not fit into your beautiful dream of how

life should be. You might even repress or deny spiritual yearnings, artistic urges or assisting needs. Sometimes the issue is that you want so **much** perfection that it seems easier to give up than to seek something unreachably high. Or you may stop at visualizing utopia, and forget to back up your imagination with effort.

Yet your faith and trust ultimate goodness will be your bulwark in life ("everything is all right"). Involvement with beauty, spiritual paths or psychic insights can feed your spirit and strengthen your connection to your Higher Self. Your intuition can be a valuable tool (but don't rely on it to the exclusion of common sense). You can dissolve the boundaries of space and time, but don't turn escapism into a full-time job. The divine, the sacred are essential in your life. Miracles and mysticism are a natural part of life for you, triggered through art, nature, religion, spirituality or helping activities.

Pluto is in your 10th house.

You seek to master your career, place in society and need for rules. You intimidate/overpower through competence, hard work, realism and authority. You probe/investigate power, responsibility, structure, security and institutions. You control (or are controlled by) duty, career demands, ambitions and status needs. You eliminate responsibilities, guilts, structures and demands which are outmoded. You bond/feel intimate in a context of caution, responsibility, safety, and structure. You concentrate on success, achievement, your career and the necessities of life. You project (facets of yourself you'd rather not face) onto Daddy or other authority figures. You share/allocate duties, practical demands, pressures and necessary limits within the framework of what is possible in the world. You test (yourself or others) against reality, the rules of the game and forces beyond personal control.

ASPECTS

Aspects refer to the relationships between the planets (or between planets and points in the chart such as the Ascendant or 1st house cusp). The relationships between the planets (number of degrees) indicate the relationships between various drives and needs in our nature (symbolized by the planets).

Every circle has 360 degrees and the circle of the zodiac is no excep-

tion. Thus each planet (or point in the horoscope) is separated from other planets (and points) by a specific number of degrees. Certain degree segments (0, 60, 90, 120, 150, 180) have traditional meanings in astrology.

The aspect which is easiest to "see" in a horoscope is the conjunction (an aspect of zero degrees). Planets which are conjunct are together in the chart. (If, for example, a horoscope has the Sun at 13 degrees 35 minutes of Gemini and Mercury is at 13 degrees 55 minutes of Gemini, we would say that the Sun is conjunct Mercury. We could also say that Mercury is conjunct the Sun.)

The meaning of a conjunction is that the themes of the two planets are mixed. It is as if these planets are married or living together. In your horoscope, you do not get one without the other. The drives they symbolize are somehow melded in your personality. The blending may be comfortable or not so comfortable--depending on the nature of the drives involved.

Interpreting a conjunction is not very different from putting together the meanings of a planet in a house or a planet in a sign. You are mixing two factors. Consider both sides: how might these two planets reinforce and support one another's themes and how might their basic drives conflict and compete with one other?

In terms of the meaning of a conjunction, the nature of the planets (or points) involved is the **most** significant. Certain planets stand for drives which "get along" easily, that is they tend to want the same sort of things, and all tend to pull in the same direction. When such planets conjunct each other, they suggest inner agreement, reinforcement and harmony. (Examples would include conjunctions between the Sun, Jupiter and/or Mars; between the Moon, Neptune and/or Pluto; and between Mercury and Uranus.)

Other planets represent drives which are contradictory or at odds with one another. Where such planets conjunct each other, the individual must strive to somehow "make peace" between possibly warring factions. Integration takes more effort. (Examples would include the Sun with Pluto, Neptune or Saturn; the Moon with Mars, Saturn or Uranus, etc.) For fullest information, however, you would also consider the nature of the sign(s) and house(s) involved in your conjunction (and any other aspects you analyze).

Ideally, conjuncting planets are separated by zero degrees. Few aspects, however, are exact to the degree. Astrology uses a concept

called "orb" to handle that. The orb of an aspect refers to how many degrees **away** from exact the aspect can be, and still be considered relevant. (If, for example, someone's Sun is at 5 degrees of Capricorn and the Moon is at 10 degrees of Capricorn, are the Sun and Moon conjunct? What if the Moon is at 15 or 20 degrees of Capricorn?) Astrologers have differing opinions in regard to orb, but all agree that the tighter (closer to exact) an aspect is, the more important it is. So closer aspects are given more weight in any analysis.

A conjunction is not the only aspect which exists, of course, although the conjunction is the most significant of all aspects. Other aspects (angular separations) provide additional information regarding the drives represented by the planets. Aspects other than the conjunction fall into two groups: harmonious (indicating parts of our nature which tend to combine easily, support and reinforce one another, where we may overdo) and challenging (indicating parts of our nature which tend to be at odds with one another, where we have to work to make room for differing drives, for ambivalent needs).

With **any** aspect, the nature of the two planets involved is **most** significant, but some additional subtle shadings are implied, depending upon the aspect involved. One can consider the conjunction the fundamental aspect. Even if two planets make an aspect other than a conjunction, it is worthwhile to think about combining their key words (as in a conjunction), as that will delineate the major issues and themes involved.

Five aspects other than the conjunction are considered important by most astrologers. They include the harmonious ("soft") aspects of the sextile (60 degrees) and trine (120 degrees) and the challenging ("hard") aspects of the square (90 degrees) and opposition (180 degrees). In addition, we have found the quincunx aspect (150 degrees) to be challenging.

Next in this report are interpretations of your closest aspects. You can also experiment with simple keyword combinations for those of your planets forming aspects. You might say, for example, that someone with a Jupiter-Saturn conjunction has a career (Saturn) tied to (conjunct) travel, education or philosophy (Jupiter). You could also say that their world view (Jupiter) is likely to be (conjunct) realistic, cautious and responsible (Saturn). Another choice would be that the father or authority figures (Saturn) are (conjunct) jovial, extraverted, confident, extravagant or optimistic (Jupiter). And there are many other combinations available. By mixing and matching planetary keywords you can come up with additional possibilities. Be open to seeing the variety of potentials that astrology pictures.

YOUR PLANETS IN ASPECT

The Sun is trine (120 degrees) the Moon

The aspect is 3.96 degrees from exact.

Family and feelings are highlighted. You can be exceedingly warm and caring. Parental instincts are likely with a desire to care for and protect others (or looking to them to provide your care).

Harmony is suggested between your confident, expressive side and your cautious, sensitive side. You can be appropriately introverted or extroverted, depending on circumstances. You can blend "masculine" and "feminine" qualities and your mother and father may have been supportive of one another.

A good sense of emotional balance is likely; you can direct your loving instincts well.

The Sun is trine (120 degrees) Neptune

The aspect is 3.28 degrees from exact.

Your creative capacities are strongly marked. You may have considerable artistic/aesthetic talent and could achieve recognition through your handling of beauty. You may have high ability in the visual arts, perhaps attracted to filmmaking or similar ventures. You might exhibit dramatic instincts, with a flair for magic, promotion, illusions, sales or other persuasive fields where you sway people emotionally.

Idealism is likely to color your love relationships. You may seek (and "see") the best in your partners and children. If overdone, you could be disillusioned when the fantasy fails and the people you adore prove to be only too human and fallible. In moderation, this quality allows you to visualize the highest potential of those you love, support and praise their assets, and generally encourage positive outcomes.

Potentially you can optimally blend pride and humility. You understand the necessity of good self-esteem and appreciating your own capabilities, but you also are tuned into the Universe, sensing the oneness of life and your place in a larger Whole. The blend allows you to both lead and follow, in a complex, graceful dance of appropriateness.

Joy, splendor, aesthetics, creativity and charisma are likely assets. You bring dreams to vivid life, inspiring others with their beauty.

The Moon is quincunx (150 degrees) Mercury

The aspect is 2.62 degrees from exact.

You may feel torn between logic and emotions or thinking and feeling. Your gut may argue with your head. If neediness, vulnerability or sensitivity overwhelms your rational side, misunderstandings with others are possible. You may take things too personally on occasion.

You can be quite clever and shrewd, but might also be high strung and restless. You tend to respond to many different stimuli and could sometimes feel bombarded by the world.

Conflicts with family members are possible, particularly if insecurities get in the way. You communicate well when feeling safe, but may clam up (or chatter as a protective distraction) when you feel threatened or intellectually unclear (deluged by feelings).

When you bring together your emotional and rational sides, you can explain touchy issues well and communicate skillfully in the realm of feelings. You may be quite glib, empathic and helpful.

The Moon is square (90 degrees) Saturn

The aspect is 4.22 degrees from exact.

You are apt to feel some degree of tension between your emotional needs and your focus on getting the job done. You may feel torn between home and family needs versus your professional role. You could vacillate between dominance and dependency, between compassion and hard-nosed realism. You are learning to compromise, to keep room for both sides.

Tension between your parents is a real possibility. They might have clashed over work issues, emotional needs or been estranged from each other. They might have fostered too much dependency or not nurtured well, perhaps pushing too hard for you to be strong and cope from a very young age. As a result, you could have some lingering insecurity about getting what you want in life. You might be afraid to be vulnerable, not trusting others to be there for you emotionally or demanding unqualified love and acceptance from others (the unconditional support you always wanted from Mom and Dad and didn't get). You may be overly susceptible to guilt or feelings of responsibility for those closest to you. You might avoid emotional matters, feeling that is the best way to maintain control. You could be touchy, moody, suspicious or feel that real intimacy eludes you. Since you tend to be serious, depression or inhibition is possible.

The challenge is to constructively blend your emotional and pragmatic nature, not denying either one, but incorporating both into life. By blending caring with competence, you can be productive as well as emotionally close; can keep room for emotional connections along with achievement.

The Moon is conjunct (0 degrees) Neptune

The aspect is .68 degrees from exact.

You are apt to be dreamy, idealistic, imaginative, sensitive and romantic. You can be quite compassionate, kind, empathic and sympathetic, but may succumb at times to passivity or escapism. You are likely to be open to psychic impressions and may sometimes be too subject to external influences.

You could idealize mothering, nurturing, your mother, homeland, or emotions in general. Your mother (and your view of nurturing) could be artistic, ill, elusive, mysterious, spiritual, rescuing or escapist. You might make security, safety or the home into an ultimate value. You could put your faith in emotions--or feel overwhelmed by the power of emotions. You are more apt to operate on a feeling (than an intellectual) level. You could also deny, rationalize, see life through rose-colored glasses or be overly suggestible and gullible. Your longing to merge, to blend, to be a part of something higher could lead you to inspiration--or temptation.

If your sensitivity and compassion is overdone, you could fall into self-sacrifice or martyrdom or take many things personally, feeling defensive. You may be manipulated by unconscious needs, unaware of many of your deeper feelings and reactions.

You have the capacity to tune into public needs and desires and may have talent for advertising, film or other media dealing with images and emotions. You are drawn toward mystical experiences.

The Moon is sextile (60 degrees) Pluto

The aspect is 3.64 degrees from exact.

You are able to handle emotions constructively and may be quite sensitive, psychic and aware of life's underlying patterns. You can tune into your own inner depths and those of other people, sensing subterranean issues, drives and needs. You may be quite empathic.

You have the capacity to balance nurturing drives with the urge for control and mastery, choosing appropriate times for each. Emotional closeness is important to you; your level of commitment to relationships is

very deep. When you care about someone, it is total.

Your mother (or mother figure) may have encouraged you to deal with issues of addiction, self-mastery, intimacy and the sharing of resources. Your inner emotional security allows you to share comfortably, to risk vulnerability, to touch souls with another human being.

You are more aware of people's hidden agenda and unconscious motives, picking up on subtle cues and clues in their language and behavior. You respond to process--not just content. You have talent for working with emotions, for dealing with the unconscious, for using intuitive insights. You may also be capable of galvanizing people or groups of people in service of transformation.

Mercury is sextile (60 degrees) Saturn

The aspect is 1.60 degrees from exact.

Your thinking can be quite organized, practical and systematic. You deal well with lists and may have business acumen. You can be quite analytical, methodical and precise with language and thinking. You have a good sense of appropriateness and can operate well in formal settings. Your judgment tends to be steady and your concentration good.

Verbal skills, finger dexterity, adaptability, thinking, relatives, or communicating may contribute to your professional achievements. You are willing to put effort and discipline into mental pursuits.

Your memory could be good. You are likely to be most interested in practical matters which can further your career. Contacts and those you know might be of assistance to your vocationally.

Logic and rationality are accentuated in this combination. You are able to be objective, sensible and unmoved by emotions. (If overdone, this quality could seem too dry, humorless or literal-minded.) You have the instincts of a scientist: check observations against reality and test ideas before accepting them.

Mercury is quincunx (150 degrees) Neptune

The aspect is 3.30 degrees from exact.

Your imagination is one of your best assets, but can seem a liability at times. You are likely to be open to otherworldly vistas, tuning into spiritual, mystical, idealistic (or unreal) images. This can be an asset in many aesthetic/artistic pursuits (including song writing, playing a musical instrument, singing, linguistic talent, etc.).

Your capacity to paint lovely pictures with words could also support work in the fields of public relations, advertising, sales, promotion, the entertainment world, etc. If the illusory qualities are overdone, you might lie or unconsciously deceive others through a need to "make nice" and keep things on a "pleasant" or idealized level. Susceptibility to drugs, alcohol or other escapist paths is possible. The membrane separating truth and fiction is very permeable in your mind; imagination and reality tend to easily blend.

If the passive tendencies of this combination are overdone, you could be susceptible to daydreaming or fantasizing rather than doing. Due to a sensitive nervous system, you tend to take in a lot of input and may end up overwhelmed, confused or absent-minded. You need to make clear priorities in your handling of information. You cannot absorb everything and have to decide what needs your attention the most at any given moment.

Your mind is potentially poetic, visionary and inspired. Your communications may have a touch of magic. You can assist and uplift others.

Mercury is square (90 degrees) Pluto

The aspect is 1.02 degrees from exact.

You are dealing with the conflict between breadth and depth, between variety and concentrated focus, and between openness and secrecy. You may feel pulled between intense scrutiny, a single-minded determination to get to the bottom of matters, versus a light, flippant, casual approach to life.

You can be quite open and naturally communicative and then clam up, obsessing about hidden agendas and self-protection. You may feel torn between directness and seeking a back door route to what you want. You can be intellectually competitive and may compare your thinking, knowledge or verbal skills to those of others.

Because you see power in the use of knowledge and communication, you could incline to verbal manipulation, intimidation, sarcasm, satire, innuendoes, or obsessiveness (or deal with any of these in others). Assigning blame, justification and excuses may be central issues in your life.

You can be quite incisive, uncompromising, enigmatic, hypnotic, opinionated, compulsive, perceptive, cunning, and thorough. You may tend to view things as all or nothing, or in a polarized framework.

You are likely to have skills in analysis, organization, thoroughness, mental strength, nonverbal interaction and a willingness to face hidden (even taboo) areas and subjects. You can back up intellectual curiosity with an incredible strength, will and endurance.

Venus is conjunct (0 degrees) Mars

The aspect is 6.54 degrees from exact.

You can be quite sensual, passionate and pleasure-oriented. You could enjoy acquiring things and may seek immediate gratification. You might define yourself through possessions, money, class or status--or identify with partnership. You are learning to blend personal will and desires with interpersonal needs and the art of compromise.

If you are unable to combine personal and interpersonal drives, you could need approval and yet rebel against it. You might feel confused about compromise, boundaries, assertiveness and compliance. Perhaps you act appeasing and smile when angry--or attract anger from others. You might feel torn between passion (lust) and affection (love) or not perceive them as aspects of each other. You may seek affiliation, yet sometimes feel trapped by it.

You can be quite magnetic and may be naturally attractive to the opposite sex. You may unconsciously put out sexual vibes. You can be quite charming, sensitive, tasteful and pleasant. You may believe in love at first sight and could respond rapidly in terms of sex.

You have a marked capacity for enjoying life--and bringing pleasure to others as well.

Venus is quincunx (150 degrees) Jupiter

The aspect is 3.56 degrees from exact.

Your ideals may sometimes be at odds with love needs or financial necessities. You are learning to ground your visions in the real world. If you become too invested in pursuing the "good things" in life or the "right crowd" (turning money or success into "God"), you may end up losing material or social rewards in order to discover a wider perspective (find a bigger God). This combination can indicate potential extravagance, exaggeration and even ostentation. Constructively, you can consistently increase your assets and instinctively expand on life's positive possibilities.

Expectations are an issue where love relationships are concerned. You may sacrifice the potential of a person or an association from an

insatiable seeking of more and better. You might keep standards so high, no one could measure up. You might feel commitment deprives you of freedom and be a flirt. You might get involved in guru/student associations, or idolize someone, placing them on a pedestal. The challenge is to relate to another human being with perspective, each of you encouraging the best in each other, without demanding inhuman perfection.

Spiritual needs may seem at odds with material demands. This could manifest as tension around money (e.g., do you try to amass more material wealth or spend resources on the pursuit of knowledge, education, philosophy, etc.). Your stable, rooted side may pull against your urge to travel, to adventure, to explore and seek the truth in wider vistas in the world. A full life requires some of each.

You can be quite pleasant, generous and forgiving.

Mars is quincunx (150 degrees) Jupiter

The aspect is 2.98 degrees from exact.

A high degree of energy is suggested, but restlessness is likely. You may slip into impatience or impulsivity, sometimes acting against your better judgment. You thrive in an atmosphere of mental stimulation, adventures, exploration, expansion and risk-taking.

Your search for an adrenaline rush could lead to gambling, speculation or trying to do too much, too fast. Although you have a great deal of energy and talent, you must sometimes learn moderation. It is easy for you to overextend yourself.

Faith may be a challenge in your life. Too much trust in your own abilities can lead to arrogance, extravagance, self-indulgence, or biting off more than you can chew. Too little faith can lead to a fear to act, a tendency to demand perfection before you extend yourself. Excessively high standards can keep you dissatisfied and discontented. You must balance intellectual understanding and physical action. Avoid the extremes of rash, foolhardy behavior or endless rationalizations and intellectualization. Keep clear priorities and reachable goals!

Issues around beliefs, values, ideals, ethics and morality are significant in your life. Although you are apt to have strong feelings about spiritual principles, avoid falling prey to religious wars! A proselytizing attitude won't win friends. Be direct about what you value, but don't aggressively push your beliefs onto others by trying to be a guru. Tolerance is an important virtue.

You have a flair for excitement which you can share with others. Your humor, liveliness, honesty and perspective can enrich people's lives.

Mars is square (90 degrees) Saturn

The aspect is 5.93 degrees from exact.

Once you get out of your own way, you can accomplish a tremendous amount. You are working on the tension between personal desires and societal demands. This inner conflict has roots in your childhood, especially your relationship with your father (or father figure).

You probably challenged authorities, or felt that they blocked, criticized and frustrated you. You may have experienced your father as abusive, angry, frustrated (frustrating), impossible to please, or insensitive to your individuality. He might have been incapable, inadequate or incompetent. Somehow, his early example is apt to have fed a sense of fear, failure, mistrust, or inadequacy in you. Since children internalize parental images, you could still be criticizing yourself and feeling less competent than you are, or more at odds with rules, regulations and responsibilities.

You may seek to establish a sense of self through what you **do**, how you perform. One extreme is giving up, feeling blocked and just not trying ("it won't be good enough," or "they'll just stop me anyway"). The opposite extreme is taking on excessive demands, feeling you **have** to do everything in order to compensate for inner self-deprecation. You need tangible results and measurable success, but you also need to practice loving yourself and appreciating your essence and your being, apart from what you can accomplish.

While you are working on raising your level of self-appreciation, your timing may sometimes be off. You might act too quickly on some projects (rashly) and hold back on others (not trusting yourself). The more you develop an inner sense of your worth, the more you can act in the moment, taking advantage of realistic opportunities, making the most of your assets.

Mars is sextile (60 degrees) Uranus

The aspect is 2.17 degrees from exact.

You are apt to be innovative, inventive and personally involved in a quest for freedom. You may be drawn by the future, attracted by the unusual or oriented toward the new. You thrive on excitement and are naturally mobile.

A free spirit, you will tend to resist being penned in, hemmed in or tied

down. You need variety and intellectual stimulation in your life. If you feel too confined, you may rebel or carry the revolutionary role too far. Trying to break loose or break free physically, or acting on impulse could lead to accidents if not balanced by some caution. You encourage individuality and uniqueness in others as well as yourself. You may have friends who are very different from one another.

You tend to be tolerant in regard to sexuality. You are probably open-minded and might even be experimental yourself. Often, however, the "anything is OK" attitude is more a mental attitude than an actual physical expression. You could experience sudden attractions ("falling in love/lust"). If the desire for freedom or new experiences is overdone, you may only want what you cannot have, enjoying the chase but not the conquest. Generally, the accent is on friendship in love relations.

You are willing to take risks, to live life on the edge. You enjoy thrills and the adrenaline rush. Creative problem solving is right up your alley. You may have intellectual and/or intuitive flashes of brilliance (even genius) on occasion. You may have an instinctive grasp of how things function (or how they might function better). Your attitudes are fresh and innovative; you are open to myriad possibilities in life.

OUTER PLANET ASPECTS

Because the outer planets take many years to circle the zodiac, they can hold aspects to one another for long periods of time. Thus, millions of people may share the same aspect between Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, Neptune or Pluto. Such aspects point to generational themes and are less individually significant than aspects involving the inner "planets" (Sun, Moon, Mercury, Venus and Mars). A Saturn/Uranus conjunction, for example, highlights a large number of people dealing with the polarization between old and new, conservative and liberal, caution and risk, or stability and change.

Although aspects between outer planets signify issues which are faced by a whole group of people, each person will confront these issues in his/her unique fashion. Some people grow and transcend through their generational issues; others experience difficulties. And people can change over time in how they handle these generational issues.

The different houses occupied by such aspecting planets will give

some clues about how individuals may approach shared themes in diverse ways. Someone who has a Saturn/Uranus conjunction in the 2nd house is likely to feel torn between a stable, "bring home the bacon" approach to earning a living, versus a desire for creativity, excitement and variety (which can end up unstable, erratic and unpredictable). Someone who has a Saturn/Uranus conjunction in the 7th is apt to feel torn between choose a safe, stable (but perhaps a bit boring) partner versus choosing an exciting, risk-taking, changeable (but perhaps a bit undependable) partner.

If the outer planets which are aspecting one another also aspect inner planets in an individual's horoscope, the personal involvement in this generational issue is likely to be even more intense.

Jupiter is square (90 degrees) Uranus

The aspect is 5.15 degrees from exact.

Enthusiastic and independent, you thrive in a stimulating atmosphere. Drawn toward variety, you could be ever on the go. Travel or new experiences of all sorts can help satisfy your restlessness. Your mind is apt to be quick and active, but you may jump to conclusions, oversimplify, overgeneralize or be impatient with other people's thinking processes. You have a talent for ideas, theories and broad perspectives.

Your natural inclination is to challenge religion, philosophy, ethics, spirituality or world views. You probably seek to innovate in terms of belief systems and may adopt a rebellious or reforming stance. You might change your opinions suddenly, or abruptly reverse your beliefs. Your desire for "absolute truth" could seduce you into a dogmatic stance, or a continual dissatisfaction with your faith. If you avoid the extremes of the "know-it-all" role or the "religion-of-the-month" club, your creativity can help you to constantly update your sense of meaning, purpose and spirituality. Your values must be true to your inner individuality.

Independence is the breath of life to you, and change has a great deal of appeal. Your desire for the new could lead you to scatter your forces, overextend, or be too impatient (demanding rapid rewards). Because you easily see the big picture, you could overlook significant details. Yet theorizing, visualizing and working toward dreams of the future are among your strengths.

Your passion for justice and truth could involve you with the law, politics, moral principles or questions of fair play. You might carry honesty to the extreme of a lack of tact on occasion. You are likely to be articulate, resourceful, bright and farsighted.

Saturn is square (90 degrees) Neptune

The aspect is 4.90 degrees from exact.

You can dream the most wonderful of dreams and envision the most fantastic of vistas, but your talents can become liabilities if not handled with care and caution. You may feel torn between your practical, grounded, hardworking, sensible side and your imaginative, inspired, visionary, and compassionate side. Bringing your dreams to earth will require effort and extra attention.

Your father (or father figure) is apt to have influenced your imagination, sense of faith (or mistrust) in the universe, ideals, fantasies, compassion, and aesthetic capacities. Clashes with father are possible, especially over issues of beauty, grace, spirituality, religion or imagination. You might have felt him to be a dreamer of impossible dreams or an authoritarian figure not open to dreams. You and he might have had a savior/victim or rescuer/enabler relationship. Your interactions with authorities offer an opportunity to learn how to realistically channel your ideals and inspiration.

If you fly too high with imagination, you may want more than is possible, yearn for the unattainable, demand impossible perfection and live chronically dissatisfied because life (especially your work and physical reality) falls short of your idealized imagery. You might feel unwilling to do anything short of an incredible spiritual mission, or demand inhuman functioning (never making a mistake) from yourself.

If you overdo your focus on flaws and boundaries, you might give up and sacrifice attainable dreams. You could succumb to depression, anxiety, illness, guilt, or pessimism. You might chronically underachieve ("If I cannot find the perfect, ideal job, I won't even try.") or give up before starting, convinced failure is inevitable.

Your challenge is to balance faith and fear. You need enough faith in yourself to risk, to try, to work toward your hopes. You need enough faith in a Higher Power to not take everyone's burdens on your shoulders, to not try to play savior/rescuer/enabler to the world. You need enough fear (or caution) to plan sensible steps toward realizing your visions, enough practicality to break large projects into incremental steps. By combining the best of both, you can become a realistic dreamer, a practical mystic and an achiever on inspired proportions.

HOROSCOPE ANGLES

In addition to the planets in your horoscope, there are sensitive points known as "angles." All angles are extremely time-dependent and thus are among the most personal points of your horoscope. The four angles are the Midheaven, Ascendant, Descendant and IC. The Midheaven provides additional clues about your career, status, ambition, position in the world, relationships with power and authority figures. The Ascendant provides additional clues about your self-expression, sense of identity, appearance, physical energy and basic instincts. The Descendant is a key to issues you face in relationships and qualities which you may meet through other people (rather than expressing yourself). The IC symbolizes themes connected to your home, family, nurturing experiences, early life, ancestry and emotional roots.

The angles of a horoscope are represented as the cross in the center of the chart. The Ascendant is represented by the heavy, dark line on the left (eastern) side of your chart. The Descendant is represented by the heavy, dark line on the right (western) side of your chart. The Ascendant reveals your "rising sign" as the sign occupying your Ascendant was "rising" (moving above the horizon) at your time and place of birth. The Ascendant is the boundary line between the 12th and 1st houses; the Descendant separates the 6th and 7th houses.

Two other angles of the horoscope are the Midheaven (also called "MC" from Medium Coeli or "middle of the sky") and the IC (Immum Coeli or "bottom of the sky"). The Midheaven separates the 9th and 10th houses and is the dark, heavy line nearest to the top (south) of your chart. The IC separates the 3rd and 4th houses and is the dark, heavy line nearest to the bottom of your chart.

The angles of a horoscope are all formed by intersections between great circles. For example, the intersections of the ecliptic--the Earth's path around the Sun--and the horizon form the Ascendant and Descendant of a horoscope. The intersection in the east marks the Ascendant. The intersection in the west marks the Descendant.

The signs on each of these angles give additional information about your potentials, and these angles can also form aspects with one another and with the planets. Traditionally, astrologers give more weight to the Ascendant and Midheaven than to the Descendant and IC. (The first two appear to be more significant.)

The following section will provide brief descriptions of the signs on your angles and also discuss aspects to the angles of your horoscope.

YOUR ANGLES IN SIGNS

Your Ascendant (Rising Sign) is Libra.

You are a natural diplomat, with a tendency to learn about yourself through relationships with other people. You may have a strong aesthetic sense, or a desire for harmony and balance in interpersonal exchanges. You can be competitive or indecisive, seeing too many sides to an issue or question. Appearances matter to you and you may sometimes seem a bit superficial to others, but you can be quite fair, just, refined and kindhearted.

These qualities may be modified by the house and sign position of Venus, which rules your Ascendant, or by any planets in the 1st house.

Your Midheaven is in Leo.

You need a sense of excitement in your work. Not for you the ordinary job. You are seeking an adrenaline rush from your vocation and could be drawn to fields involving drama, entertainment, fame, speculation, creativity, children, love or risk-taking. Your flair and magnetism are potential assets vocationally. Authority figures may seem larger-than-life (or arrogant). You work best when feeling "up."

This description will be modified by the house and sign position of the Sun, which rules your Midheaven, and by any planets occupying your 10th house.

Your Descendant is in Aries.

You are learning about independence through relationships. You could share a sense of freedom with a partner, or attract individuals who are unwilling to commit or are too self-centered. Your interpersonal exchanges offer opportunities for you to know yourself better, assert yourself and become more forthright, direct and courageous.

These possibilities can be affected by the house and sign position of Mars, which rules your Descendant, and by any planets occupying your

7th house.

Your IC is in Aquarius.

Your home is likely to be unusual in some form. Perhaps it is open to the world, full of computers, astrology or anything progressive. You may feed the free flow of information and knowledge domestically. You attract variety, change, and the unexpected in your home.

These potentials will be modified by the house and sign position of Uranus, which rules your IC, and by any planets occupying your 4th house.

ASPECTS TO YOUR ANGLES

The Sun is quincunx (150 degrees) your Ascendant

The aspect is 3.95 degrees from exact.

You may face a challenge around self-esteem (too much or too little). A healthy sense of pride in yourself may be lacking (or too much egotism and arrogance might exist).

You might inhibit (or overdo) your funloving spirit, speculative or risk-taking side. You are learning to express your inner child in a constructive manner. You need positive excitement in your life. You can be quite creative, but may hold back on your talents. You can be quite playful, joyful and confident, but may go overboard with your fiery impulses, or inhibit and hold back in your self-expression. You are learning to be naturally expressive, constructively confident and instinctively dramatic in ways which will add zest to your life.

The Sun is sextile (60 degrees) your Midheaven

The aspect is 1.01 degrees from exact.

Power feeds your self-esteem. You may feel most energized when in charge. Leaders or authority figures may assist you in career advancement. Your willingness to risk might help you to gain status. Your creativity may augment your authority. Your dynamism, star quality and pride can reinforce your power drive.

Your inner child harmonizes with your vocational aspirations. Your

worldly aspirations harmonize with your funloving spirit; you know when to work and when to play. Your drive for excitement may enhance your vocational accomplishments. Loved ones may assist your career development.

Your status may be fed by your need to shine. Your reality quotient harmonizes with your speculative side and risk-taking. You can meld competence and confidence.

The Moon is sextile (60 degrees) your Midheaven

The aspect is 2.95 degrees from exact.

Your habit patterns may assist your career. Your need for security could support your desire for authority. Your feelings may assist your handling of responsibilities. Your receptivity may enhance your authority.

You can comfortably combine compassion and pragmatism. You can be caring as well as capable, integrating strength and gentleness. Your caretaking instincts could aid your career or nurturing figures could contribute to your status.

Family and professional matters may enhance each other. You can harmonize emotional needs and realism, keeping family and career mutually supportive. Women, emotions, family or your home could contribute to your career. Your drive to nurture could harmonize with your vocational aspirations.

Your career ambitions may amplify your security needs. You may seek safety through power. You can be compassionate as well as competent and your caring instincts could enhance your contribution to society. Women, emotional matters, food, shelter, clothing, or basic commodities could contribute to your material success. Your emotional warmth may be a factor in your achievements.

Mercury is square (90 degrees) your Midheaven

The aspect is 5.57 degrees from exact.

Authorities may clash with your thinking and/or communicating. Your perceptiveness or awareness may bother authorities. Media clashes or power plays around information may affect your work. Logic may not offer your best route to success. Youthful attitudes may clash with older, experienced approaches. Maintaining objectivity regarding your own authority (or toward authority figures) may be a challenges.

Your practical/serious side may compete with your lighthearted side.

Your career aspirations may clash with your social needs or desire for variety. Your capacity to be flippant may not blend with your ambitions. Vocational aspirations may seem at odds with informal learning and exploration. You may feel torn between adaptability and flexibility versus structure. Casual curiosity may seem incompatible with your serious, dedicated desire for success as knowledge-seeking could pull you away from professional demands. Mental restlessness could challenge your drive to accomplish something tangible. (You may get bored easily with your duties.) Learning through observation may seem to clash with learning through experience; both are essential.

Your critical/realistic side might inhibit your urge to communicate. Your need to control could compete with your adaptability and flexibility. Relatives might clash with your career drives or status needs. You or a relative might choose to pursue power rather than using logic or rationality.

Power issues may affect commercial transactions. Transportation snafus could affect your career. Paperwork may seem an impediment to your professional aspirations. You are learning to integrate lighthearted detachment and serious pragmatism, to achieve while continuing to expand your base of knowledge.

Venus is conjunct (0 degrees) your Descendant

The aspect is 5.42 degrees from exact.

You are likely to seek themes of pleasure, grace, beauty, indulgence, ease, and gratification in your relationships. This can include the possibility of much enjoyment of people and relationships. If, however, you are looking to your partner to supply the goodies in life, you might attract someone who is too materialistic, stodgy, or stolid. You might get involved with partner who are physically attractive but have little depths. You might fall into relationships with people who are artistic flakes or self-indulgent hedonists.

If you share these themes with those you love, you may literally make beautiful music (or other forms of art/aesthetics) together. You may enjoy communing with nature, or share a love of back rubs, hot tubs or other sensual gratifications. You can truly like one another and communicate much affection to each other. Physical contact appeals; you enjoy giving each other pleasure. You may also help each other financially or in terms of the physical resources of the world. You can be easygoing and accepting of one another, flowing smoothly into each other's lives to bring more grace, affection and enjoyment.

Neptune is sextile (60 degrees) your Midheaven

The aspect is 2.27 degrees from exact.

Art, beauty, magic, inspiration or dreams could assist you vocationally. Visualization and imagination can help your career. Intuition may assist your practical accomplishments. Your compassionate, caring, rescuing side may contribute to your work. A desire to help and heal may augment your professional role.

Your mystical side may harmonize with authorities. Authorities may aid your quest for infinite love and beauty. Authority figures could contribute to your faith or trust in the best. Your status could be aided by your capacity to dream or your ability to merge and transcend. Your seeking of power may be directed toward experiences of Oneness or Union.
